This matter came before the Iowa Insurance Commissioner on this Joint Motion, Consent to Order, and Order executed by the Iowa Insurance Division, as Petitioner, and Kelly Joneson, as Respondent. Pursuant to the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth herein, the Joint Motion of the parties shall be **GRANTED**, and this Order is hereby issued.

### Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Commissioner of Insurance (the "Commissioner"), Doug Ommen, directly and through his designees, administers and enforces Iowa Code Chapter 508E Viatical Settlement Contracts, and 191 Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 48 Viatical and Life Settlements.
- 2. On January 16, 2018, the Division filed a Statement of Charges and a Verified *Ex Parte* Motion for Entry of Emergency Order. In response to those filings, also on January 16, 2018, the Commissioner, pursuant to Iowa Code §§508E.16(4) and 17A.18A and Iowa Administrative Code §191—48.10(5), issued an Emergency Order to Cease and Desist (the "Emergency Order"). Among other things, the Emergency Order suspended the Respondent's viatical settlement broker's license and directed Respondent to furnish the Division with proof of the existence of current errors and omissions coverage as required by Iowa Code §508E.3(1)(b)(2).
- 3. The Statement of Charges, the Verified *Ex Parte* Motion, and the Emergency Order were served on the respondent on January 17, 2018.

- 4. Subsequent to service of the Emergency Order and other documents on respondent, Respondent did, in fact, furnish the Division proof of the required errors and omissions coverage.
- 5. By providing evidence of existing errors and omissions coverage, Respondent is in compliance with the requirements of Iowa Code §508E.3(1)(b)(2). This constitutes cause for the lifting of the suspension of Respondent's viatical settlement broker license.

#### Order

- 6. The Emergency Order entered on January 16, 2018, is hereby revoked and set aside in its entirety.
- 7. The suspension of respondent's viatical settlement broker's license is lifted, and that license is reinstated.
