Now comes the Iowa Insurance Division ("Division") pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa Life Insurance Companies Act - Iowa Code Chapter 508 and the Iowa Insurance Other Than Life Act – Iowa Code Chapter 515 and enters into the following Order and Consent to Order ("Consent Order"):

I. PARTIES AND JURISDICTION

- 1. The Commissioner of Insurance, Doug Ommen, pursuant to Iowa Code § 505.8 (2019), administers and enforces the Iowa Life Insurance Companies Act Iowa Code Chapter 508 and the Iowa Insurance Other Than Life Act Iowa Code Chapter 515. Commissioner Ommen has designated James N. Armstrong as Deputy Commissioner of Supervision.
- 2. Senior Health Insurance Company of Pennsylvania ("Senior Health") is an Indiana corporation with a last known mailing address of 550 Congressional Boulevard, Suite 200, Carmel, IN 46032, Attn: Barry Lee Staldine, President and Chief Executive Officer.
- 3. Senior Health is and has been issued a Certificate of Authority with the Division since April 27, 1989.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 4. The Division issued Senior Health a Certificate of Authority on April 27, 1989 and assigned NAIC number 76325.
- 5. Senior Health filed a Uniform Consent to Service of Process (the "Consent") on November 26, 2014. In submitting the Consent, Senior Health designated the Commissioner as an agent for service of process.
- 6. On or about March 1, 2019, Senior Health filed an annual statement of financial condition for the year ended December 31, 2018 reflecting capital and surplus of a negative \$466,872,975.
- 7. Senior Health did not maintain at least \$5,000,000 in capital and surplus, or the minimum capital requirements of chapter 521E, whichever is greater, as required by Iowa Code §§ 508.5 and 515.8 (2019).

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 8. Paragraphs 1-7 are incorporated by reference.
- 9. Senior Health failed to comply with the minimum capital and surplus requirement under lowa law to maintain a license or authority to transact the business of insurance.
- 10. The violation of Iowa Code Chapters 508, 515 and applicable rules is grounds to order the suspension of the license or authority to transact the business of insurance within the state pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 508.15A, 515.69 and 515.143 (2019).

IV. ORDER

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to the powers granted to the Division pursuant to

Iowa Code Chapters 505 and 515.

Α. The Iowa Certificate of Authority issued to Senior Health Insurance Company of

Pennsylvania shall be immediately suspended. The period of suspension shall be continuous

from the date of this Order until terminated by further written order of the Commissioner.

В. Senior Health Insurance Company of Pennsylvania shall not solicit or issue new policies

of insurance or assume any lowa risk.

C. Senior Health Insurance Company of Pennsylvania shall file its annual financial

statement and pay any fees and taxes required to be paid under lowa law.

D. Senior Health Insurance Company of Pennsylvania shall administer any existing claims

and policies of insurance issued to persons residing in Iowa.

E. Nothing contained in this Order shall in any way limit the right of the Division to institute

administrative or legal action against Senior Health Insurance Company of Pennsylvania for any

other past conduct or future activity in violation of lowa laws or administrative rules.
