Pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 522B—Licensing of Insurance Producers and Iowa

Administrative Code rule 191—10.10, this matter comes before the Commissioner of Insurance
upon an application by Thomas Clyce for the reissuance of his Iowa resident insurance producer
license.

#### I. PARTIES AND JURISDICTION

- 1. The Commissioner of Insurance, Doug Ommen, directly and through his designees, administers and enforces Iowa Code chapter 522B—Licensing of Insurance Producers pursuant to Iowa Code § 505.8.
- 2. Applicant Thomas Clyce ("Applicant") is an individual with a last-known residence address of 2907 54th St., Des Moines, Iowa 50310 and a National Producer Number of 10523084.
- 3. Applicant has filed an application with the Iowa Insurance Division ("Division") for reissuance of Applicant's Iowa resident insurance producer license and an application for an individual producer license though the National Insurance Producer Registry ("NIPR").
- 4. The Commissioner is authorized to issue this order pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code rule 191—10.10.

### II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 5. On March 27, 2008, Applicant applied for a resident insurance producer license with the Division by submitting a Uniform Application through the National Insurance Producer Registry, in which he designated the Commissioner as an agent for service of process.
- 6. Applicant was issued an Iowa resident insurance producer license on March 27, 2008, and held that license until the Division suspended his license on January 2, 2020.
- 7. On October 28, 2019, the Division received a Certificate of Noncompliance from the Iowa Department of Revenue ("IDR") indicating that Applicant had a debt that qualified for license sanctioning. IDR sent Applicant a copy of the Certificate of Noncompliance.
- 8. On October 28, 2019, the Division mailed Applicant, by both restricted certified mail and by first-class mail, notification of the Division's intent to suspend his license if IDR did not withdraw the Certificate of Noncompliance within 60 days pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code rule 191—10.23.
- 9. On January 2, 2020, the Division issued an order immediately suspending Applicant's insurance producer license ("Suspension Order"). Pursuant to the Suspension Order, reinstatement or reissuance of the Applicant's producer insurance license was contingent upon IDR withdrawing the Certificate of Noncompliance.
- 10. Applicant's resident insurance producer license expired on September 30, 2020, while still in a suspended status.
- 11. On March 30, 2025, Applicant filed an Iowa Insurance Producer Application for Reissuance as required by Iowa Administrative Code rule 191—10.10.
  - 12. As of March 30, 2025, IDR had not withdrawn the Certificate of Noncompliance.

- 13. On April 10, 2025, the Division issued an order denying Applicant's Iowa Insurance Producer Application for Reissuance ("Denial Order"). The Denial Order ordered that Applicant would not be eligible for license reinstatement, reissuance, or renewal until all of the following occurred:
  - a. IDR issues a Withdrawal of the Certificate of Noncompliance;
  - b. Applicant makes the appropriate Application for Reinstatement or Reissuance and this application is approved by the Commissioner or his designee;
  - c. Applicant pays all applicable fees; and
  - d. Applicant complies with all other insurance statutes and regulations.
- 14. On April 17, 2025, IDR provided the Division with a Withdrawal of Certificate of Noncompliance and advised that Applicant is now compliant with IDR.
- 15. On April 27, 2025, Applicant filed an Iowa Insurance Producer Application for Reissuance as required by Iowa Administrative Code rule 191—10.10.
- 16. Applicant has complied with the terms of the Denial Order and demonstrated that he is now eligible for license reissuance.

## III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 17. Iowa Administrative Code 191—10.10(2)(a) states that a producer whose license has been suspended by order may apply to the Commissioner for reissuance of his or her license by filing an application for reissuance and that the applicant shall initiate the proceedings for reissuance by filing an application for reissuance with the Commissioner. Applicant has met this requirement.
- 18. Iowa Administrative Code 191—10.10(2)(b) states that the application for reissuance must allege facts sufficient to enable the Commissioner to determine that the basis of

the Suspension Order no longer exists and that the Applicant has not engaged in the business of insurance while suspended. Applicant has met this requirement, and the terms of the Suspension Order have been satisfied.

19. Iowa Administrative Code 191—10.10(2)(c) states that the application for reissuance must allege facts sufficient to enable the Commissioner to determine that it is in the public interest for the application to be granted. Applicant has met this requirement.

20. Applicant's resident insurance producer license should be reissued.

#### IV. ORDER

# IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

A. Applicant's Iowa Insurance Producer Application for Reissuance is granted, and the administrative block is removed from his Iowa licensing record;

B. Applicant's Uniform Application for Individual License Registration is approved;

 C. Applicant shall immediately be permitted to transact and participate in the business of insurance in Iowa; and

D. Applicant shall refrain from any further violations of Iowa law and abide by all insurance laws in any jurisdictions in which he is or becomes licensed.
